

## **The Esubi Trust – Updated Report 2014**


Esubi would like to take this opportunity to thank BFSS for the generous grant you gave which enabled the construction of Ekiwumulo Nursery School in Ekiwumulo Village. Ekiwumulo (meaning a place of freedom and restoration) is a group of nine foster homes for orphans, centred around a primary school, and vocational training centre, providing a community of support.

The construction of this nursery building and provision of resources is currently supporting education for around 250 children and this is set to rise to 500 in the near future. This stage of education is crucial for children in Uganda as it provides them with the foundation knowledge of English, which is a third language for many of these children, but the primary language of education in Uganda. We currently have 4 teachers focused on infant education ensuring that the children are given the best start in life.

Work was completed on this project in August 2012 with the construction of 3 rooms for Baby, Middle and Top class to study. There are around 30 children now studying in each of these classes. A team of volunteers from the UK were able to come and complete the final furnishings and paintings allowing the children to start in the building at the beginning of their new term.

In Uganda levels of basic illiteracy and numeracy are high, with projects like this we can help give the stepping stones to children out of the poverty cycle as well as providing them with the chance to be children in a culture where growing up can come all too quickly. Ekiwumulo is currently ranked as one of the top schools in the Mityana District and is achieving outstanding results, with 70% first grades achieved last year which is well above national average. Foundations for such achievement are crucial and it is for this reason that the very kind and generous donation made by BFSS has been appreciated over and over again by the staff and support workers at Ekiwumulo Village.
